From the Superintendent Mr. Kraus

The 2019-20 school year is off to a great start as staff and students settle into their new routines at Friend Public School. I would like to commend the staff for all their hard work in preparation of a new year and also the students for adjusting to their new classes and routines.

A couple of reminders that are new this year. Our school day will start at 8:05 and dismiss at 3:29 on regular day schedules. We will have 2:00 early outs on the last day of school for the week, which is typically a Friday. If we have a shortened week, the 2:00 dismissal will land on the last day of that week.

Celebrations for EMF FFA.



The EMF FFA chapter has several events to celebrate. In July, the chapter received notification from the National FFA Organization that their National Chapter Award received a Nation Two-Star rating out of a possible three-star rating. The National Chapter Award measures the quality of a chapter's activities. Chapters must meet quality criteria in 15 different areas. The award focuses on three overall categories of growing leaders, building communities, and strengthening agriculture. Chapters must first apply for this award at the state level and be rated in the top 10% in the state in order for their application to be forwarded to the national level. The FFA officer team worked on this application heavily throughout the year with Josie Vyhnalek leading the way on the application.



The next celebration for the chapter is that two of our members will receive their American FFA Degree's. Darren Segner and Maggie Vyhnalek's American FFA Degree applications were approved by the National FFA Board of Directors to receive their degrees.

The American FFA Degree is the highest honor an FFA member can receive in the organization. This award is based off of their records on their SAE (Supervised Agriculture Experience Project), FFA involvement, and Community Service hours. It is also important to mention that only .01% of FFA members attain this honor. We are incredibly proud of both of these members' accomplishments.



On August 25th, our chapter held our first meeting for the new school year. We had between 50-75 members and community members in attendance. Our FFA Alumni group also gave a presentation on becoming a booster member and encouraged new members to join. <u>Nebraska Concussion Awareness Act – Quick Facts</u> <u>Amended 2014</u>

Concussion Awareness Act applies to:

- ✓ Approved or accredited public, private, denominational or parochial schools (does not include higher education/college and university) Section 4.
- ✓ Athletes 19 years of age or younger that participate in organized sports ("any city, village, business or nonprofit that organizes sports, charges a fee or is sponsored by a business or nonprofit organization.") Section 5

Education provided for:

- Coaches. Training approved by the Chief Medical officer must be made available to all coaches.
- Parents and student athletes. Concussion and brain injury information must be provided:
 - o On an annual basis and
 - Prior to the start of practice or competition.

Removal from Play

- ✓ Any student athlete or athlete shall be removed from play when they are reasonably suspected of having a concussion by a coach or licensed health care professional.
- ✓ If an athlete is removed from activity due to reasonable suspicion of suffering a concussion:
 - Parents or Guardians must be notified of the date and approximate time of the injury and the signs and symptoms that were observed, as well as any actions taken to treat.

Return to Play

- ✓ A student-athlete or athlete may be allowed to return to play when:
 - They have been evaluated by a licensed health care professional
 - They have received written clearance from the licensed health care professional;
 - They have submitted the written and signed clearance to resume participation in athletic activities accompanied by written permission to resume participation from the student's parent or guardian.

• Return to Learn

Establish a return to learn protocol for students that have sustained a concussion. The return to learn protocol shall recognize that students who have sustained a concussion and returned to school may need informal or formal accommodations, modifications of curriculum, and monitoring by medical or academic staff until the student is fully recovered.
