FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT MR. KRAUS

Although the weather has been very good to us this fall, we know changes are around the corner. Cold winter winds mixed with snowy conditions can make it very difficult and dangerous for students and transportation. As superintendent of the school, it is my duty to determine if school should be cancelled or have a delayed start.

With our Blackboard Connect communication program, you will receive a voice mail, email and text informing you of cancellation or delays. Please make sure your contact information is updated and current with the schools Powerschool information system to ensure you receive these messages. I will also contact local radio and TV stations with this information, but Blackboard will be your first and quickest means of receiving this information.

In an attempt to facilitate the planning process, I am offering the following information:

- When there is a credible potential of severe winter weather, I will attempt to make a determination by 6:00 AM if we are going to cancel school or simply have a delayed start to the school day.
- If your kids ride the bus, and we have a one or two hour delay to the start of the school day, simply add the one or two hours to their usual pick-up time—this should provide parents with a reasonable estimate as to when to expect the bus to arrive.
- Please have a plan in place for your children. Winter weather can surprise us and quick decisions need to be made. Having a family plan in place now will help you if transitions are necessary if school is cancelled.

Mrs. Gautreaux's Lasagna — Shirley Gautreaux

1 lb. lean ground beef
1 jar of Prego (flavored with meat) spaghetti sauce
2 eggs
1 24 oz. carton low fat cottage cheese
1 to 1 1/2 t. salt
½ tsp. pepper
2 tsp parsley flakes
¼ cup Parmesan cheese
1 package of lasagna noodles

3 cups shredded mozzarella cheese

Bring 4 quarts of water to a boil, and then add 9 lasagna noodles and boil for about 5 to 10 minutes. This will sometimes boil over, so watch carefully. Brown the ground beef slowly and spoon off excess fat. Combine the ground beef and the jar of spaghetti sauce. Set aside and begin to combine the eggs, salt, pepper and parsley flakes. Mix this and then add the parmesan cheese. Finally add in the cottage cheese. Use a 9 x 13" pan.

Layer three of the noodles on the bottom of the pan. Layer tablespoons full of the cottage cheese mixture on the noodles. I usually just drop three large tablespoonfuls on each of the noodles. Next, spread 1 c. mozzarella cheese evenly over this layer. Next, layer the meat sauce mixture the same way as the cottage cheese mixture. Layer more noodles and repeat. Finally, add the last layer of noodles and end with the meat sauce.

This can be frozen, refrigerated or baked immediately. If the lasagna is frozen, thaw completely before baking.

If the lasagna has been refrigerated, bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes. Be sure that the lasagna bubbles in between the strips of the noodles before removing from the oven. Then let the lasagna stand for ten minutes before serving. This time allows the cheese to set up and makes it much easier to serve.

If the lasagna has not been refrigerated, the baking time usually will be around 35 minutes.
