On September 11th, the Friend Board of Education approved the 2017-2020 strategic plan at the monthly regular board of education meeting. Included in the plan is a newly adopted mission and belief statements as well as priorities, strategies and objectives. The Friend Strategic Plan is intended to assist the board, administrators, and staff in their responsibility to create and sustain a school district in which students are engaged and learning. The priorities listed in the strategic plan focus on Academics, Student Support Services, Human Resources, Communication, Technology, Board Policy, and District Resources. This is a living document which will give us a direct focus on school improvement. We are excited to have a specific vision of improvement that will help us grow together. The strategic plan was a collaborative effort with community, staff, students and board members who invested a lot of time and energy in the creation of the plan. We would like to thank all of those who helped throughout the process. The strategic plan will be available online through out school district website at friendbulldogs.org

The board also approved the 2017-18 budget at the regular board of education meeting. Two hearings took place to review the proposed budget, tax asking, and to allow for community feedback. The total levy will be set at .86 which is down from last years .89. Valuations in our county increased around 3.5%. Overall, we will be asking for \$125,000 less in the total budget. 
Fire Prevention Week- October 8th-14th- Elementary students will visit our local fire station on Tuesday October 10th.

Sophomores Study 'Westward Movement'

The Sophomore American History class recently completed a unit of study on wesward movement. The morning was spent touring Homestead National Monument's visitors' center and viewing the movie 'Land of Dreams,' using GPS handheld devices and compasses to find historical points of interest on the Homestead's prairie and a visit to the Freeman one room school house. After lunch the students viewed the new orientation video in the visitors center before retracing a portion of the Oregon and Pony Express Trails at Rock Creek Station State Historical Park near Fairbury. Students also visited the site of the legendary shooting of David McCanless by Wild Bill Hickok.
