From the Superintendent Mr. Kraus



Greetings:

It has been a great start to a new school year, and it is so nice to have everyone together back in person. I know our teachers are glad to be back in their classrooms working with their students. Our kids have been fantastic with all the new protocols, and this is a direct reflection of such supportive parents and amazing teachers.

We continually are evaluating our risk exposure and making accommodations that correlate with our given situation. We have remained healthy at FPS but know that could change in any given day. An activity protocol is included in this newsletter, and we will receive plans from other schools when visiting their facilities. We will try to post those on our website and social media so you know what to expect. Each plan is a little different given the size and layout of each school.

Some of the main points when attending our activities are to try and social distance, sit in smaller groups, and have your children sit and remain with you during the entire activity. If you do not feel well, please stay home. We will try to STRIV all indoor activities.

Budget: In September, the board of education will approve the budget. Our valuations remained steady with a slight decrease. Our budget for the upcoming year mirrors the previous budget, so our tax asking and levies will remain very similar. We are always diligent with our expenditures and continue to build a healthy savings.

Technology: Our school has made significant improvements with our infrastructure and has new equipment for our teachers and students. Much of the technology is discounted through our ERATE funds and several grants. It is always nice to have funds outside of our general fund to help offset those costs. We are looking at implementing a 1 to 1 program for our 7-12 students. More information will come once we receive all our equipment, which has been backordered.

Facilities: Our school building continues to be in great shape, and no major projects took place this summer. One area we will focus our attention on is our roof to make sure it is safe, secure and dry. We will be putting together a plan for repairs and replacement to ensure we take care of everything underneath. Roofs can be extremely expensive to fix, and we do not want to be unprepared when the day comes.

Lastly, we will have our school accreditation visit this fall. A team of educators will review and evaluate our school improvement goal and provide feedback to us. This is always exciting to showcase what we are currently doing and get information on how we can improve. This visit is through the NDE and is required every 5 years. Due to COVID, we were not able to host this last spring, so we are anxious for them to come.

Parent permission forms for college visits are due BEFORE the student is gone from school or the absence will *not* be considered excused. Forms are available in the office.

Friend Public School Protocols

APPLIES TO ALL ACTIVITIES

Masks are recommended but not required. Please social distance as much as possible while attending FPS activities.

Students are to sit with parents during entire contest.

Admission is **FREE** for all spectators.

Programs will be available via QR code. No paper copies.

Parents and fans are asked to leave the facility at the conclusion of the contest. Please do not go on the court/field at the end of the contest or congregate in the upper level of the gym facility.

JV and HS Volleyball

Fans

Visitor Seating located on the south side of the gym. Please enter through the east old building entrance.

Home Seating located on the north side of the court. Please enter through the north entrance.

Phase 3 seating capacity 50% - 550 rated capacity 1100

Phase 4 seating capacity 75% - 800 rated capacity 1100

We ask that everyone please do their best to social distance and/or wear a mask if social distancing is not possible.

Based on Directed Health Measures, seating in groups should not exceed 8 spectators.

Restrooms

There is one set of men's and women's restrooms available. Mask wearing is recommended while using the restrooms.

Concessions

We do not have the ability to offer separate concession stands and thus recommend social distancing while in line and recommend the use of masks while at the concession stand.

Concessions will be limited to prepackaged items.

Teams

Locker rooms will be provided for teams if requested, but we encourage your team to come dressed.

Teams will not change benches between sets. No high fives or handshakes.

Fans

Visitor Seating located in the south half of the bleachers or standing on the east side of the game field.

Home seating located in the north half of the bleachers or standing on the west side of the football field.

Please maintain social distancing guidelines and/or wear a mask if you are unable to socially distance. Group sizes should be limited to 8 or less per DHM guidelines.

Restrooms

Men's and women's restrooms are located in the concession stand building on the west side of the facility and are limited.

Concessions

We do not have the ability to offer separate concession stands and thus recommend social distancing while in line and recommend the use of masks while at the concession stand.

Concessions will be limited to prepackaged items and will not be available at JH contests.

Teams

Locker rooms will be provided at the high school. Please enter the school though the west entrance off Elm Street. You will be met by FPS personnel and directed to the locker rooms assigned to you.

JH/JV teams should come dressed for the games and go directly to the field south of Burley Park.

Press Box

Space is available for a camera person and a coach, but social distancing is not possible in the press box. We respectfully request that your personnel in the box wear a mask.
