Spring Flowers and Safety Tips Are Blooming...

Spring is a great time for family fun and activities! A few safety tips to keep the fun times healthy...

- * Allergy season is upon us. Allergies can cause a multitude of symptoms including sniffling, sneezing, coughing, itchy or puffy eyes, post nasal drip, headaches and earaches, to name a few. Consult with your doctor about the best treatment options, and limit your time outdoors on days when the pollen or mold counts are high; you can check daily particulate counts on the Weather Channel.
- * Start thinking about sunscreen. As short sleeve weather approaches, don't forget to be prepared with sunscreen. That first seasonal sunburn is the most damaging to the skin and can surprise you even on a cool spring day. Apply sunscreen every few hours for the most effective coverage, and don't forget to protect your eyes with sunglasses or a breathable hat!
- * Make outdoor time a safe time by wearing a helmet when riding bikes, skateboards, and scooters. Knee pads and elbow pads are easy to wear and add even more protection.
- Poison Ivy, Oak, and Sumac contain oils that may cause an allergic skin reaction that looks like swollen, itchy, red bumps and blisters wherever the oil has touched the skin. Check the areas around your home and teach your kids to recognize and avoid these plants.
- * Stinging insects will soon be back. If you are stung, remove the stinger as soon as possible with a scraping motion. Wash with soap and water and apply a cold compress. If trouble breathing, severe swelling or fainting occurs, call 911 right away.
- * Ticks can be a problem in our area...use tweezers or fingers to grasp as close to the head as possible and pull the tick away from where it is attached. Call the pediatrician for symptoms of a rash or fever following exposure.
- * Remind children not to approach an unknown animal and not to disturb a sleeping animal or any animal that is eating. If a bite occurs, wash wounds well with soap and water and call the pediatrician.
- * Remember to hydrate. Sweat and exercise deplete the body of essential fluids, so keep those water bottles filled and close by!

EMF FFA Members Shine at District Career Development Events

The EMF FFA chapter traveled to SCC Beatrice on March 1st to compete in district and state qualifying CDE events. We had a total of 31 competitors that day, and we succeeded in qualifying six teams for state, plus we had a district championship team in Ag Sales. The members have been working hard and studying since January for most of these competitions, and we are proud of all of their hard work and accomplishments.

Livestock Management- 5th out of 24 teams, Kole Svec, Cade Kresak, Kylie Weber, Peyton Pribyl- 2 points from qualifying.

Ag Tech and Mech- 4th place out of 17 teams, STATE QUALIFIER, Ben Bartu, Mikey Bartu, Jayden Capek, Kole Svec. Ben was 7th individually out of 68 competitors.

Agriscience- 11th place out of 24 teams, ADVANCING to STATE, Zach Spohn, Reagan Bartley, Will Vyhnalek and Jayden Capek. Zach was 2nd place individually, and Reagan was 10th individually out of 96 individuals.

Ag Sales- DISTRICT CHAMPIONS out of 8 teams, STATE QUALIFIER, Ella Archer, Vivian Weber, Kiah Songster and Will Vyhnalek. Ella Archer was 3rd individually, Vivian was 7th, Will was 8th, and Kiah was 9th out of 32 individuals.

Natural Resources- 2nd place out of 11 teams, STATE QUALIFIER, Christian Weber, Fred Hausman, Spencer Eberspacher and Shelby Lawver. Christian was the 1st place and top individual, and Fred was 10th place I ndividually out of 44.

Agronomy- 2nd place out of 13 teams, STATE QUALIFIER, Chase Svehla, Peyton Pribyl, Zach Spohn and Spencer Eberspacher. Chase placed 4th individually, and Zach placed 8th individually out of 52.

Floral- 2nd place out of 17 teams, STATE QUALIFIER, Cameryn Brandt, Vivian Weber, Abbie Milton and Shelby Lawver. Cameryn was 3rd individually, Vivian was 6th, and Shelby was 9th out of 68.

Vet Science did amazing well but was missing a team member, so we couldn't place as a team. Individually, Kylie Weber was 6th, Reagan Bartley was 14th, and Shyann Smith was 13th out of 48.

The chapter will be heading to State FFA Convention in Lincoln on April 6-8 and competing and participating in several CDE events, Jr. Public Speaking, Hall of Chapters, Middle School People in Ag Event, Ag Issues Academy, State FFA Degree's, and Nebraska FFA STAR Finalist. It will be a busy couple of days in Lincoln, but our members are prepared.
