Superintendent's Desk

Over the last several months, the Friend Board of Education and administration have met and spent hours listening to stakeholders and our students as we reviewed and eventually adopted a five-year strategic plan for the district. With the help of the Nebraska Association of School Boards (NASB) we compiled data, reviewed it, and set out a plan that looks at areas of strength, but also areas for us to grow.

At FPS we have many things to be proud of. Some of our strengths include:

- Current state and upkeep of our facilities
- Parent and community involvement
- An educated staff with low turnover
- Strong School Foundation Board
- Strong overall culture

In listening to all stakeholders, we learned of some areas to improve. At FPS, we must:

- Increase parking for school events
- Improve the state of the lunch program
- Work to increase the diversity of programs we offer.
 - HAL (High Ability Learner) Program
 - In Person Spanish
- Create consistency in grading
- Work to create more supports of mental health

After compiling all of the data, we created a strategic plan that focuses on no only what stakeholders wanted to see but also some areas that the board of education and administration saw as needs as well. We then looked at prioritizing these areas and set to work on improvement.

Some of these goals were already in the process of implementation before the strategic plan was created. Much of the areas to improve have already been addressed in some form and will continue to be strengthened over time. So far, we have:

- Created an afterschool HAL program for students who qualify in grades 4-6
- We have begun discussion with teachers on what grading should look like.
 This will take time, but will result in changes in the next two years
- We are working to provide different lunch menu options
- We are working with ESU 6 on a Mental Health Initiative to help our students.
- We are working to create opportunities to partner with area businesses, entities, and parents to help our students as a team.

Another area of concern that has been on my radar for the last year and is now becoming more pressing, is accessible daycare. I am working with community members and will be reaching out to other entities in order to try to work towards a solution to this growing problem.

As superintendent, I am always looking for input from the community. I look forward to the work over the course of this five-year strategic plan. I also look forward to the continuing partnership with Exeter-Milligan as we look to work together to improve the educational experience for all of our students by keeping our sights on continuous improvement.



All juniors and seniors will be attending an Education Quest college planning and financial aid session on October 4 here at Friend Public School. An informational letter will be sent home with students the middle of September. *Parents and guardians -- you are encouraged to join us*!

The college planning and financial aid session will run from 10:00 am to approximately 10:45 a.m. in the media center. Juniors will then be excused back to class, and the seniors will take part in Apply2College Day from 11:00 to 12:15.

Juniors and seniors have been encouraged to create an account on EducationQuest.org and start exploring all this organization has to offer, including information about careers and colleges.

Juniors and seniors have also been encouraged to schedule a college visit soon!

- Juniors are allowed *one* excused absence for a college visit. It's never too early to start looking!
- Seniors are allowed *two* excused absences for college visits. I highly encourage them to get one in ASAP since they'll be taking part in Apply2College Day on October 4.
- Parent permission forms for college visits are due BEFORE the student is gone from school or the absence will *not* be considered excused. Forms are available in the office.

IMPORTANT TEST DATES

October 25, 2023 - invited Juniors take the PSAT

November 8, 2023 - all Sophomores take the PreACT

• This short assessment predicts student performance on the ACT and offers career-interest information to students, parents, and teachers. It also helps ensure students take the best classes to prepare them for college and their options after high school.

December 6, 2023 - all Sophomores (and some Juniors) take the ASVAB

March 26, 2024 - all Juniors take the ACT

<u>Seniors are highly encouraged to retake the ACT between now and December to make sure they have the highest score possible to impact potential financial aid and scholarships.</u>

- Ms. Hottovy will be holding two sessions during parent/teacher conferences so parents & guardians of seniors can learn more about college, deadlines, scholarships, etc.
